The **1979 FIFA World Youth Championship**, was held in Japan from August 26 to September 7, 1979.

The winner was Argentina, who beat holders Soviet Union by 3-1, in a final held at Tokyo's National Stadium. This was the stage for a young kid named Diego Armando Maradona who later would become the FIFA Player of the Century.

16 Nations were represented in Japan '79, what it's now called The FIFA U20 World Cup. Among the 16 nations was Canada and among all players who shared the stadiums, the pitch and the passion with Diego Maradona, was our Technical Director Lou Nagy.

Lou Nagy learned to play soccer around the Hamilton area, just like you are here in Ancaster; and his hard work and dedication as a young player got him to places most of us dream of. Nevertheless, if you dream and work hard at it, dreams do come true.

We are proud to say, Coach Lou is our Club's Technical Director and directly or indirectly he has much to do with your player development in this club.

He has held countless Coaches Clinics for all Ancaster Soccer Coaches and his knowledge, his experience and his passion has been passed on to all coaches of this club to pass on to you, "the player".
